Welcome to January. Good bye 2018 (and to many, good riddance), Hello 2019!! The stock market has been on a roller coaster most of December and retailers, especially the online kind, had one of their best years ever. The St. Louis Blues are still in a funk, not able to string together more than a 2-game winning streak and remaining below .500 for the season. Bryce Harper and Manny Machado are both still unsigned, with many hoping that the Cardinals have a chance to sign Harper. January 21st marks the 2019 Martin Luther King, Jr. Day and the first of 3 supermoons this year, with this first one coinciding with a total lunar eclipse. A supermoon is when there's a full moon coinciding with the moon's perigee, e.g., when the moon is

closest to earth –which means the moon will be bigger and brighter than at any other time during the year. The other two are on February 19th and March 21st. The 116th Congress convenes on January 3rd, and with the congress controlled by the Democrats and the Senate by the Republicans, most experts don't expect too much of consequence to get done, other than several impeachment votes out of the house. Lastly, expect a field day of candidates seeking the Democratic nomination for the 2020 Presidential election. So far, Massachusetts Senator Elizabeth Warren has created an "exploratory committee" and expect at least 15 or more candidates to follow suit.


Movie Night, Sunday Night, January 20th, 2019

Mark Your Calendar: Saturday March 16, 2019-9AM-4 PM- Missouri State Highway Patrol Boating Safety Course,

We’ve arranged with the Missouri State Highway Patrol to come onsite at the Peaceful Valley Lodge on Saturday, March 16th, 2019 for their boating safety course. I know what you’re saying—“I’ve been boating for years, so why do I need to take a boating safety course?” Well, for one thing, it’s a state law: if you were born after January 1st, 1984 and 14 or older, you need to carry a boating safety certificate and picture ID when operating a boat. Second, there’s an economic advantage--many boat insurance companies give discounts for clients who complete boating safety certificates.

Third, it’s great to do a refresher if you took the course when you were 14 and you’re now over 60, like me. The course is 9-4 on a Saturday. Since space will be limited, we’ll be putting an online reservation system in place right after the first of the year. There is no charge for the course, but we will be requesting an \$10.00 per person or \$40.00 per family deposit with your reservation. Because it's an all-day course, we'll be providing morning and afternoon drinks and snacks, and a lunch of Subway sandwiches, chips, cookie, and soda, coffee, tea or water. You can use your deposit to pay for that, but if you don’t want the lunch or snacks, your deposit will be refunded to you when you sign in the day of the event.
