### **Web Site Enhancements**

You'll notice that the Peaceful Valley Service Company references have been changed to reflect the establishment of the Public Water Service District #1 of Gasconade County.

### Maintenance Completed in October and November Maintenance Schedule

The maintenance team was busy in October. Because of the warmer weather, grass, weeds and brush have kept growing resulting in continued weed and brush control. A new pool security cover was installed to keep the pool clean during the off-season. Contractors from Washington Pools and Spas drilled 72 holes around the pool to install pegs that hold the spring-tensioned straps in place. After the cover installation, the water level in the pool was lowered just over a foot to just underneath the skimmers and pool-safe anti-freeze added to winterize the pool. The pool cover will keep the water clean of leaves and debris over the winter and make it much easier to open up in the summer.



Work was completed on patching 5 of the worst leaking manholes as part of the drainage system. Contractors from Waterproofing Solutions used a two-step process over a 2-day period. The first step was to inject a polymer into the various cracks that penetrates through the concrete casting and seals it from the outside. They

returned the next day to cover the with a concrete-like inside mixture to seal the inside of the casting. In the case of at least one of the manholes, the concrete lip was severely cracked and had to be repaired. See the before and after pictures to the left. This is one of several steps to help in bringing the lagoon into compliance with EPA guidelines.

In addition, the restrooms at the marina, beach, and campground were cleaned up, winterized, and locked down. The campground is now officially closed until next spring. Planned maintenance for November includes brush hogging the backside of the dam since the weather stayed just wet enough and didn't allow it to happen in October. As the leaves continue to fall, the maintenance team will clean up common areas and monitor ditches and culverts to keep them clear of leaves and branches. The speed bumps will be removed in time for winter to make it easier for the crews to clear the roads when it snows.

# Work Day October 22<sup>nd</sup>.

We held a work day on October 22<sup>nd</sup>. Probably because of the phenomenal weather, we only had 10 people volunteer to work. Among the things accomplished during the work day was collecting

several bags of trash along the more heavily travelled roads within the development. ALso, additional fish cover was added around the lake, and the bigger cracks in the tennis court were filled so the court can be resealed sometime in November.

We started at 9:00 AM and were pretty much done by 12:30. We followed the work day with Burgers,

# Nearby Restaurant Reviews: Public House Brewery and Tap Room, St. James, MO

November marks the 2<sup>nd</sup> anniversary of the opening of the Public House Brewery and Tap Room in St. James, MO. Public House started in Rolla as a small brew pub, but through a chance encounter between the owners of the St. James Winery and the two Josh's that started Public House, the two companies entered into a partnership to build the Brewery and Tap Room in St. James. Beginning with craft-brewed beer and a small kitchen, they've since expanded to create a lovely garden that's shared with the winery. The garden has a waterfall, firepit, bocce courts, an out-sized chess board, and cornhole games. Servicing the garden is an outdoor kitchen featuring brick-oven pizza and locallysourced pub burgers, reubens, Italian sausage, trout fritters, and chicken schnitzel. For lighter fare, they offer meats and cheeses, pretzel bites, quail egg crositini, mac and cheese, chips and dip, hot assorted nuts, and a pickle plate. For sides, they offer German potato salad, a green salad and a "vineyard vegetable of the day." You'll pay a little

bit extra for the locally-sourced organic fare, but it's well worth it as it supports several farms, many of which are our neighbors just a stone's throw from Owensville. On the more spirited side, Public House offers their own craft-brewed beers, ales, and ciders ranging from a lighter hefeweizen, to a stronger IPA, along with their award-winning cream ale. Public House also offers seasonal beers along with the occasional "guest beer" from other Missouri craft beer producers. They carry a complete selection of St. James wines along with a very respectable collection of Bourbons, American Whiskeys, and single-malt and blended Scotch. Public House opens at 11 AM every day and closes at 6 PM Sunday-Tuesday, 10 PM Wednesday and Thursday, and 11 PM on Friday and Saturday. They host live bands, and have a variety of events including Movies in the Vineyards, Sip and Paynt, and Cookin' with Gabe.
